II.1 Animal health attestation		
I, the undersigned official veterinarian hereby certify, that the <u>[meat]</u> <u>[minced meat]</u> ⁱ described in Part I:		
II.1.1	derives from animals identified and registered in the national identification system ensuring the traceability of the animals to the herd of origin.	
II.1.2	derives from animals that were born and bred in the exporting EU Member State or in another EU Member States that has been approved by Iran for export of bovine meat.	
II.1.3	derives from animals that have remained in a region which has been free from foot-and-mouth disease (FMD) for the previous 12 months and has not practised vaccination against FMD during that period.	
II.1.4	contains only meat <u>or minced meat</u> of skeletal muscle origin or derives from bovine animals coming from herds that were not subject to animal health restrictions due to bovine brucellosis during the past 42 days.	
II.1.5	derives from herds that are not placed under movement restrictions for the control of anthrax during the 20 days prior to slaughter and that have not come into contact with bovines coming from herds which do not meet these conditions.	
II.2. Public health attestation		
I, the undersigned official veterinarian hereby declare that I am aware of the requirements of Regulations (EC) No. 852/2004, (EC) No.853/2004 and (EU) No. <u>2017/625854/2004</u> and certify that the meat <u>or minced meat</u> described in Part I was produced according to those requirements, in particular that:		
II.2.1	With regard to bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE): - The meat <u>or minced meat</u> comes from an EU Member State with negligible or controlled BSE risk status as recognized by OIE. The meat or meat products do not contain and are not derived from specified risk material as defined in Annex V to Regulation (EC) No 999/2001 of the European Parliament and Council), or mechanically separated meat from the skull and vertebral column from cattle over 30 months of age; and the animals from which this product is derived have not been slaughtered after stunning by means of gas

II.2.4	The exporting country has introduced a national monitoring and control programme for residues in animals and animal products ensuring that drugs used in veterinary medicine comply with provisions laid down in Directive 96/23/EC and that hormonally active substances for growth promotion are not used.	
II.2.5	The meat <u>or minced meat</u> is fit for human consumption and was treated in such a way as to avoid contamination with tissues defined as specific risk material (SRM);	
II.2.6	The meat <u>or minced meat</u> complies with limit values laid down by the Codex Alimentarius Commission for specific substances and residues thereof in line with Directive 96/23/EC.	
II.2.7	The meat <u>or minced meat</u> complies with the relevant criteria set out in Regulation (EC) No 2073/2005 concerning microbiological criteria for foodstuffs.
